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World of Essential College Vocabulary: Instructor's Manual

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Using World of Essential College Vocabulary – Book 1

Knowledge of word meanings is an important and robust predictor of academic success at the college level. However, developmental students often lack wide and rich vocabularies, as well as strategies for acquiring words independently. This book and companion Book 2 prepare college students for academic work by teaching important words and vocabulary learning strategies. The predictable lesson format and instructional supports facilitate independent student use. However, we recommend that instructors introduce each lesson, at least briefly. The book is easily used as either a supplementary or core text.

This book teaches 240 words, as well as common derivatives. The twelve lessons are grouped into four sections, each focusing on strategies: (1) dictionary and dictionary websites – lessons 1-3, (2) context clues – lessons 4-6, (3) combining context clues with the dictionary – lessons 7-9, (4) prefixes, roots, and suffixes – lessons 10-12. Each lesson is divided into two parts, which may be taught separately. Each lesson (except for the first) has an instructional theme. Examples are "words that are verbs and nouns" (lesson 3) and "-er,(-or,)-ist, -fuland -less" (lesson 10). In some lessons, the theme is used only in the first part, avoiding student confusion that can result when too many words are similar. Lesson sections that are *not* themed teach valuable words that help prepare students for rigorous academic work.

Words were chosen based upon general adult usage, as reflected in word frequency corpora, lists of words important to college success, words suitable for teaching word elements, and pilot studies. Before the books were published, they were used extensively in developmental classes.

Additional resources for instructors can be found on an website at **login.cengage.com**These include a PowerPoint to aid the instructor in introducing each lesson, additional teaching tips, and further background on the book. A complete testing program, and answers to tests, and answers to book exercises are found both in this printed manual and on the website. Tests are included for each lesson, for each half lesson, for each section (lessons 1-3; 4-6; 7-; 10-12) for each half of the book (1-6; 7-12), and for the entire book (a final). (**Note that half-lesson quizzes repeat the lesson quiz items.**)

A student website at **cengagebrain.com** includes (1) interactive flashcards and (2) audio, which also can be accessed through cell phones, allowing students to hear book words and sentences.

Some noteworthy features of this book are

- extensive exercises in varied formats, including reading and writing, to ensure learning
- inclusion of important derivatives for each word (e.g., simulate, simulation)
- attractive and illustrative visuals; marginal notes that add to student understanding
- informative nonfiction passages that illustrate words in context
- repetition and underlining of previously taught words in subsequent lessons
- guides to parts of speech, spelling word endings, pronunciation, and dictionary entries
